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Reading Update

As a school we are working hard on improving a number of areas across the school. We have had a particular focus on improving the teaching and enjoyment of reading this term across Kiwi. Teachers have been busy spending their evenings completing training on the latest research and best ways to teach reading. We have introduced a new Phonics scheme. We have held a parents workshop for Phonics. *(If you missed the parents workshop details are on the school website)*. The library has had a face lift and we have introduced Reading Ambassadors and Book Club! The aim of all this is to give children the best possible opportunities and best teaching available so that they become enthusiastic and competent readers. This is an area we will be continuing to develop. If you would like to get involved in helping us improve reading provision for our children we would love your help. We are looking for volunteers with a love of reading, who could spare us some time on a weekly basis to sort and organise library books. This person would have to undergo a DBS check .

Reading Ambassadors

Our Resource Base and EYFS children were delighted to welcome Reading Ambassadors into their classes this week. Some of our reading role models in Year 6 were selected to share their enjoyment and expertise as readers with some of our younger children. Being a Reading Ambassador is a great way for children to develop leadership and skills and helps promote our love of reading across the school. Both the younger and older children involved really enjoyed the experience. It was a great opportunity for enrichment in the reading curriculum.

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Parent Communication Applications

You may be aware that for some time we as a school have been using different ways of communicating certain things with you, in a variety of apps such as Tapestry and Seesaw. With different year groups and classes using different ways to communicate with you it became confusing to parents. After review and looking at how much these platforms were costing the school we have decided to switch to a consistent approach across the school. We are currently in the process of setting up Class Dojo. The Class Dojo app can be downloaded by parents for free. The transition from old systems to Class Dojo will take us a few weeks. More information will follow about this shortly.

Harvest Collection

During Harvest week we will be collecting food for Salisbury and Amesbury Foodbank. We know with the cost of living crisis people are relying on food banks more than ever. If you are able to, please sign up via School Gateway (**Go onto Gateway, Payments, Harvest Festival Walk, consent and add a comment stating you are able to come with us to the church**) and meet us in the school entrance at 1.45pm.

The Service will finish in time for the end of the school day, with a little extra time for parents of Key Stage 2 children to make it back in time to collect them. We ask that all Key Stage 1 children are collected from the **Church by 3:00 if they are going home straight from the service.**

Any children booked into the Wrap Around After School Club on this day will walk back to school with teachers. In the event a child has not been collected by 3:00 we will also take them back to school. However, this is an emergency measure as from 3:00 our staffing ratios will only definitely cover the After School club children.

Please do your best to support us with this and pick up in a timely manner. Should you need someone else to collect your children, please clearly identify them by name on Gateway.

We are very privileged to have The Revd Catherine Gillham CF who will be helping us host this service.





